

Greenwich Public School

Frequently Asked Questions



Is the school expansion definitely going ahead?

Yes. Funding has been announced in the 2017/18 State Budget and has been allocated. The project has been announced by the Minister for Education. The Design and Construct contract is currently being tendered and the Development Application for both campuses are currently being assessed by Lane Cove Council.

How many students will the school be able to accommodate?

The project will provide 24 new permanent classrooms increasing the school's capacity to 670 students, across the two school sites. The aim of the project is to increase permanent teaching space and minimise the building footprint to meet the enrolment projections of the school to 2031.

When will construction start?

It is anticipated that construction works will commence in late 2018, subject to planning approval and the new teaching spaces will be ready for teaching early 2020.

What new facilities will be added to the school?

A total of 24 new teaching spaces which will add capacity and replace all existing demountables currently on site. In addition, the school's administration and staff spaces will be upgraded to meet requirements, the new building will include a library, the existing Hall will be expanded and student amenities will also be improved.
