Bee-Bots in KSM!

Inspired by the ICT excursion at Macquarie University on Wednesday 25 November 2015, KSM had a fun-filled morning back at school the following day. Students applied the programming skills learnt during the 'Bee-Bots' program to participate in four game-based learning activities. These hands-on activities encouraged collaborative learning as students used positional language (forwards, backwards, left, right) to program their Bee-Bots. Students were actively engaged as they worked together to solve problems encountered.

Activity 1: Spelling Mat

Students took turns to program the Bee-Bot to move around the mat to spell a collection of given sight words.



Using their numeracy skills, students programmed their Bee-Bots to navigate around

Activity 2: Snakes & Ladders

the game board.

Activity 3: 2D Shapes Mat


Applying their knowledge of 2D shapes, students programmed the Bee-Bot to move around the mat and stop on a pre-selected 2D shape.
