# **Principal's Message**

Good afternoon Parents, Carers and Friends of Greenwich Public School.

#### Presentation Assembly.

Congratulations to all award recipients and to the new incoming leadership team who were announced. I would also like to thank parents, carers, family and friends who attended.

I would like to acknowledge the wonderful example that our 2017 school leaders have made to our school. They have set a high benchmark for others to follow and I am confident that the incoming student leadership team have learnt from their example.

2018 looks like a very good year.

#### Gold Award Assembly.

Our final Gold Award Assembly for 2017 was held on Wednesday 29 November. Congratulations to all students who received awards including our Banner award winners.

#### 2018 Survey and Program Changes.

Thank you to those families who completed the survey from School Council.

The information has been invaluable to set some new priorities for 2018 and our next 3 year plan. Coupled with your feedback there has been some in-depth analysis of our finances and how we appropriate our funds available.

Our programs at Greenwich Public School are funded in varying ways. This is a mixture of monies received by our school allocation by the Department of Education and monies received via school contributions as well as direct funds for specific programs such as sport, dance and gymnastics.

Over the past few years the monies received by school contributions has decreased and we have currently received approximately 50% of the required amount to fund programs such as Mandarin. This equates to a significant shortfall over recent years and has necessitated a change of program delivery.

We are therefore unable to offer Mandarin as an additional program in 2018 and it is with regret that we are saying farewell to Ms Gu and thank her for the program she so aptly delivered to students.

Following from the survey results we are looking at bolstering the STEAM program for the school and will be changing the school contribution amounts and program delivery in 2018 to reflect an increase to the STEAM program. There will be an opportunity to discuss this further in 2018 at the usual P&C and School Council forums.
