Learning from Home

Thank you for your continued efforts assisting your children learning from home. We understand and appreciate the complexity of juggling parental, schooling and work commitments.

I am confident in the high calibre of the Learning from Home program K-6. Most teaching staff are working from home to maximise their time to develop quality programs and connect with their students. We are hopeful that expectations are clear for students and helpful for parents. These expectations may be communicated in various ways for example:

- o Learning objectives and success criteria at the beginning of a lesson
- Symbols on the weekly overview to indicate tasks for which teacher feedback can be expected or when specific materials are required



The communication of clear expectations assists your children to feel safe and successful. As their teachers from home, we are hopeful they are also of support to you.

Be assured, your children are doing a great job! They are connecting with their teachers, completing assigned tasks and doing their best. Stage 3 students must be commended for their independence and mature work habits. I would particularly like to acknowledge the Stage 3 students learning onsite for assisting Stage one peers to

connect to their class Zoom catch ups. It's a team effort and commendable display of peer support and school spirit.

I highly value opportunities to engage with you and look forward to the P&C meeting next week where I will overview the Learning from Home program K-6 and outline some tips to support you throughout this period.

Attendance information

The system for reporting attendance at school during the learning from home period is that students will be marked as 'flexible' attendance in line with DoE guidelines. Students whose parents do not indicate that they are working from home and do not provide a reason will be marked 'absent' after **9:30 am.**

The Greenwich Road campus is currently meeting the needs of students in attendance onsite, averaging 19% each day. On a recent visit to the Kingslangley Campus I took a moment to admire the magnificence of the magnolia in full bloom. What a sight!

Update - VALID 6 online science test

Year 6 students were scheduled to complete the exit Year 6 online science assessment from 28th August. Unfortunately, schools that are in level 4 restrictions (learning from home) will not be able to undertake the assessment in this window. A version of the assessment will be made available after 3rd September to support our school-based assessment and will provide useful data about student progress in science.

In the meantime, please check in with your Stage 3 child to see if they are accessing and completing the weekly online science lesson. Science is covering many literacy outcomes at present as well as scientific understanding outcomes. As a guide, students should be spending approximately 1 hour on science per week.


Early Stage 1 - Learning from Home - Week 4

It's not just the students in Kindergarten having fun with the online learning program.




























Stage 3 - Learning from Home - Week 4
