# R/Principal's Message



## Welcome back Kindergarten and Year One!

Kindergarten and Year One students streamed through the gate with great excitement to return to face-to-face teaching and learning on Monday and they haven't stopped smiling! Neither have their teachers; who have frequently remarked how quickly the children have settled back into school routines.



The children have grown in every possible way and it's clear that parents and carers, working in partnership with teachers have achieved well beyond what might be imagined. Teachers have been so impressed with the children's progress in literacy, across both Kindergarten and Stage 1.



# The wait is almost over for all students 2-6 who will return to onsite learning on Monday 25 October.

Given the quality of transition programs and parental partnerships, I am confident that next week will be a happy finale to a most challenging period. We'll all be back onsite, engaging face-to-face in teaching and learning and very mindful of the privilege to do so.

We are working with our volunteers to support their distribution of orders which will likely begin mid next week. Thank you to our parent helpers who are doing their best in difficult circumstances and thank you parents for your patience and understanding.

It's pleasing to advise that all graffiti on the Kingslangley Campus has been successfully removed and we are working hard to tidy the grounds in time to welcome students back onsite. Wellbeing for families during remote learning

Dear Parents/Carers,

Some of you will have farewelled your children at the school gate this week for the first time in months! It can be a difficult transition to **suddenly be unaware of what transpires** from the time the school bell rings, after a term of being so involved with our children's school days. Acknowledge your feelings and remind yourself it is normal to feel apprehensive at this time. Remember that **teachers will always communicate with you** about things that are important. You can **also talk to your child about their day** in ways that are less likely to elicit one-word responses!

Some questions you can ask your child instead of "how was your day?".

- 1. What made you laugh today?
- 2. Tell me an example of kindness you saw.
- 3. Was there an example of **unkindness**? How did you respond?
- 4. What was the 'peak' and the 'pit'?
- 5. Does everyone have a friend at recess?
- 6. Tell me something you know today that you didn't know yesterday.
- 7. How did someone fill your bucket today? Whose bucket did you fill?
- 8. Rate your day on a scale from 1-10. What would make it one number higher?

- 9. How were you brave today?
- 10. If you could **change one thing** about your day, what would it be?


