As you will be aware, the Premier announced a staggered return to face-to-face schooling last Friday.

- Monday 1 November Years 2 and 6 return
- Monday 8 November Years 3, 4 and 5 return

It is anticipated that we will return with Level 3 plus restrictions. This may change in line with any updated Health advice. From 25 October, all staff onsite must be fully vaccinated. Planning for a smooth transition back to school has commenced and we look forward to advising you further before the end of term.

In the interim, the Learning from Home program will continue in its current format with all school operations on the Greenwich Road campus until the end of this term.

Wellbeing for families during remote learning

Dear Parents/Carers,

If your young person is struggling to get started each day, you are not alone. It can be tempting to let routines slide as we experience lockdown fatigue and difficulty with motivation. Some ideas to start the day right:

Kaleidoscope Science Online Incursion



P&C UPDATE

- BOB CAMPBELL OVAL -

Bob Campbell Oval is the largest public space in Greenwich and is also used by the school from time to time. There are plans to substantially change the reserve and while the P&C offers no opinion on the specific of the proposals, we wanted to make the school community aware of these plans.

Lane Cove Council intends to proceed with plans to create an artificial playing surface at Bob Campbell Oval alongside new public amenities and a Shared User Path running along St Vincents Rd to St Leonards. A start date has not yet been confirmed, but could be as early as October. Public access to BCO would be very limited during construction.

The **<u>Greenwich Sports Club</u>** committee have endorsed the Council's plans as they believe a new surface will increase the capacity for use of the oval by soccer players

Other community users have expressed concern that the current plans ensure a shared public space will predominantly be restricted to a single-use sport.

A new Group, **Natural Grass at Bob Campbell Oval** is proposing that the area be transformed into a fully refurbished grass pitch using latest techniques and an improved maintenance plan at a fraction of the cost of synthetic. A natural grass pitch will enable its continued use by entire families all year, support biodiversity, **significantly reduce heat impacts - including on our junior players**, and better support the entirety of **our** community and the Greenwich Village Games activities.
