Afternoon parents and carers,

It was great to meet so many some of our community members at the P&C meeting on Wednesday night and to be formally introduced to the community. A massive thank you to Dom Patton, Myles Kennedy and Anne Woodbridge and all the other community members that have made me feel so welcome to the Greenwich community. At the P&C meeting there was some great discussion about some wonderful initiatives on how to reengage the community with the school and build that sense of community.

COVID-19 updates

The Premier yesterday announced a number of changes to COVID-19 restrictions. Those changes have not yet been incorporated by the Department of Education so please know that restrictions are still the same as they were at the beginning of the week. Once the changes to restrictions have been communicated to school they will be sent out to the community.

At the end of last week, COIVD-19 restrictions eased slightly with community users being allowed back on school site after school hours. This has meant that our band tutors and P&C meetings have been able to be face-to-face over the last week. Please know that students are still using hand sanitiser when entering the classroom and teachers are still required to wear face masks inside. The next round of RATs has been delivered to the school. At the moment the school has been directed to not distribute these. Once information about distribution has been sent to the school I will pass that information onto the community.

Please know that parents and carers are able to attend school when:

- picking up a sick child
- attending the front office when required (e.g. to drop off materials, pick up or drop off children or to conduct financial transactions)
- making a purchase at the uniform shop
- attending a critical meeting with the principal or other staff member when invited

Staffing updates

- Congratulations to Angela Kiehne who is expecting her second child. She will be taking maternity leave from the start Semester 2. We wish her all the best and look forward to hearing about the new addition to her family.
- Gerry Fitzpatrick our school General Assistant (GA) finished up this week. Gerry has been with the school for many years, as a teacher, Assistant Principal and then as the GA. We wish him all the best as he transitions into retirement.
- Hannah Walters has separated from the School Administration Manager (SAM) role. She will continue in that role until a new SAM is appointed.
- There is also a teacher position that is currently going through the merit selection process.
- Mrs Hallam and Ms Hodges are the Relieving Assistant Principals on Stage 2 with Anna Parrella the Assistant Principal of Stage 3.

Parent teacher interviews

It was discussed at the executive meeting this week and the team feel there is a huge disconnect, compared to pre-COVID times, between teachers and parents. We are at the stage where parents are starting to be allowed back on site and we would like to have

the face-to-face parent teacher meeting sooner rather than later to rebuild that parent teacher relationship.

Communication guidelines

The executive staff have put together communication guidelines to make communication between home and school more streamlined and consistent. All staff have been emailed the guidelines for their input. Once the staff have given feedback the document will be sent to the P&C for their feedback before being finalised and sent to the community.

Road safety

In the afternoon, whilst I have been on duty, I have unfortunately witnessed unsafe driver behaviour that puts our students at a greater risk of harm. I have seen parents perform a U-turn on Kingslangley road whilst the street is very busy, parents double park so their child can get into the car, cars parked very close to the crossing obscuring the view of the crossing and parents leaving their car in the 'no parking' zone whilst they walk into school. I realise that the traffic in the afternoon can be challenging but ask that we all follow the road rules, be patient and calm to ensure the safety of our students.

Greenwich Road play equipment

The play equipment on the K-2 site is very dilapidated with parts of the equipment sectioned off due to the safety risk to the students. I am embarrassed about the state of the equipment and have had discussions with the P&C executive team about replacing the equipment. Yesterday, Dom Patton and I met with representative from an equipment company to get a rough idea of the cost involved in the project. K-2 teachers are also going to work with their class to have students design their own play equipment layout so that we get student input into the design. When available, updates on the project will be included in the newsletter and through the P&C.

School Student Travel Term 1 2022



School student travel information for parents and studentsSchool Travel

Passes

Students who need a School Opal card or travel pass but have not yet applied need to <u>apply</u> or <u>update</u> their details as soon as possible.

In the Opal network, students should travel with a Child/Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their <u>local bus operator</u> to discuss their travel needs.

New Student Opal cards (including new Term Bus Passes) will be sent to the student's nominated postal address within two weeks of their application being approved.

Students living in rural and regional (R&R) areas will receive their travel pass from their nominated transport operator. It may be issued via their school or be sent directly to themat home. **Note**: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

Terms of Use

Students using Opal cards must tap on and tap off in line with the Opal terms of use.

All students are required to comply with the <u>Student code of conduct.</u> The code of conductaims to ensure the safety and well-being of school children and other passengers. It is important that parents ensure their child is aware of this, as failure to comply with the code of conduct can result in a suspension from travel.

DOUBLE PARKING

Do not double park at any time. Double parking is illegal and dangerous especially around schools. It reduces visibility and blocks the road for other motorists.



U TURNS

- Performing U turns or 3 point turns in school zones is extremely dangerous.
- Performing U turns across unbroken centre lines is illegal and is particularly dangerous around schools

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PARKING / STOPPING NEAR INTERSECTIONS

It is illegal to park or stop less than 10 metres from an intersection with no traffic lights as this blocks visibility for turning drivers and creates a hazard for all motorists.

PEDESTRIAN CROSSINGS AND CHILDREN'S CROSSINGS

- Slow down as you approach pedestriar crossings and children's crossings.
- · Do not proceed if the road beyond the crossing is blocked.

- At a children's crossing you must stop at or before the stop line if there is a pedestrian about to cross or already on the crossing.
- Do not proceed through a children's crossing until all pedestrians have completely cleared the crossing.

HOLDING HANDS IN TRAFFIC

- Children need assistance in the traffic environment until at least the age of 10. They are not equipped physically or developmentally to make the crucial decisions to keep themselves safe
- All children need to be actively supervised in and around moving vehicles, footpaths, shared paths, driveways, car parks, at traffic lights, pedestrian crossings, on quiet streets and busy roads.
- Make sure you always set a good example around traffic and talk to your children about why you are stopping at the kerb and what you are watching and listening for Explain where and when it is safe to cross and why
- · Hold hands with your children around traffic. If your hands are full, make sure your child holds onto your bag, pram or even your arm or sleeve.

NO STOPPING ZONES

No Stopping signs mean you must not stop here at any time. If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction applies only at those times An unbroken yellow kerb line is a no stopping line. You must not stop for any reason



BUS ZONE SIGNS

A Bus Zone is a No Stopping zone for vehicles other than buses. If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction applies only at those times. You must not park your vehicle less than 20 metres before or 10 metres after a bus stop.
